

Fix: Control Panel is Not Showing All Programs on Windows 11

If the Control Panel is not showing all programs on Windows 11, you can try the following steps to troubleshoot and resolve the issue:

1. **Restart Your Computer:** Sometimes, a simple restart can resolve minor issues. Restart your computer and check if the Control Panel displays all programs correctly.

```
rundll32.exe shell32.dll,Control_RunDLL hotplug.dll
```
 - This will open the Control Panel. Check if the programs are now displayed correctly.
6. **Check Installed Programs:** Verify that the programs you're looking for are actually installed on your system. Sometimes, programs may not be listed in the Control Panel if they are not properly installed.
7. **Create a New User Profile:** If the issue persists, create a new user profile and check if the Control Panel displays all programs for the new user. If it does, the problem might be specific

to your user profile.

8. **Perform a System Restore:** If you recently installed or updated software that may have caused the issue, you can perform a system restore to revert your computer to a previous state when the Control Panel was functioning correctly. To do this, search for "Create a restore point" in the Windows search bar, and then click on "System Restore" to follow the on-screen instructions.
9. **Reinstall Problematic Programs:** If specific programs are not showing up in the Control Panel, consider reinstalling those programs. Uninstall them first, then download and reinstall them from their official websites.
